Good evening,

As Mayor of Barcelona, it's a pleasure to welcome you to the City Hall, in this magnificent "Saló de Cent", the Salle of the One Hundred.

This is a hall built in the 14th [fourteenth] Century and it was here were the first municipal government of Barcelona, what was called the "Council of the One Hundred", used to gather.

Nowadays, it's the venue where the most important events of the city take place.

For Barcelona, it is a great honor to host for the first time the Eurocities Social Affairs Forum. This is a great occasion to share knowledge and experiences, mutual learning and the exchange of good practices.

Barcelona is convinced of the importance of cities in the construction of Europe and their commitment to ensure a social Europe.

In this sense, I am very satisfied that Barcelona has been chosen to work on the new Social Investment Package, adopted by the European Commission.

Cities and local governments must work together to claim a more active role. We are the level of government that is closest to people, and therefore cities must be taken into account in the design, promotion and implementation of social policies.

Barcelona has always defended this idea. We are a capital with a strong European vocation and we have become a European reference in social affairs.

Barcelona is a **city of culture, knowledge, creativity, innovation and wellbeing.**Our first priority is to attend those who are suffering the effects of the economic crisis

We have increased our social budget by 30% [thirty per cent] in the last two years, and we are developing a model of collaboration with the third sector of social action.

A model of social collaboration that has been recognized at European level, because the civic and voluntary sector is essential for social cohesion and economic recovery.

Together, we are promoting equity with policies and initiatives to assure people's wellbeing and quality of life.

As a result of the crisis, we have new profiles of poverty and social exclusion. We have families that suddenly don't have income; families that are evicted; or young people that have little chances to find a job.

We must give responses to all of them. As you have seen today, we have increased the number of centers for homeless people, and we are opening new social care equipments.

We have also improved important services like the telematics home care for the elderly and we are covering people's basic needs, like food, energy and utility supply, and affordable housing.

Cities and metropolitan areas are the engines of economic growth. But they also concentrate economic inequality and unemployment. This is why cities must work together to face these challenges with determination.

We are proud that Eurocities has chosen Barcelona to celebrate its Social Affairs Forum. Together we will lead the claim of cities to have a more active role in the new European Social policy.
